#### **GUIDING PRINCIPLES**

- Relationships are the foundation. An effective early learning system functions on strong and healthy relationships, not just between adult educators and children, but also between caregivers and teachers, and professionals across agencies designed to support the success of Florida's young children.
- Mental health is fundamental. The mental health of children, caregivers, and early learning providers is critical to the success of Florida's early learning system. Yet, too many caregivers and early learning professionals struggle with their mental health in isolation, amidst stigmas, and without support. An effective early learning system requires us to ensure a wide range of accessible and non-intrusive mental health supports are available – from peer groups to more clinical interventions.

- Families' basic needs must be met. Child care but one of several basic needs a family must a dress to support the healthy development of th children. Addressing early learning in Florida w have limited impact without ensuring families a healthy, economically secure, have food on the tables, and have safe and affordable housing.
- It takes all of us. Achieving this vision for Florida's High expectations are coupled with sufficient early learning system requires all of us - from support. All of Florida's children can achieve. families and early childhood educators to early Florida's early learning system must maintain learning center owners and directors, from pediahigh expectations for the quality of early learning tricians to business leaders, from elected officials, experiences across settings AND provide the government agency staff, and policy makers to support needed to help early learning providers, Early Learning Coalition leaders, and health and teachers, parents, caregivers, and young children social service partners. 
